NOTES:

1. Bills have been filed in some states where ASAP is not currently active such as Illinois and Florida. In general, these bills are based on older versions of the model legislation and cover 8 to 10 products.
2. For items followed by a * in the table, energy efficiency supporters and manufacturers have agreed to national standards and such standards have been recommended for inclusion in pending federal legislation. However, several of these standards have been recommended for three years or more and none have been enacted because of gridlock on a national energy bill.
3. In addition to the products covered in the table above, California has also adopted standards for the following products:
 - Audio and video equipment (TVs, portable radios, VCRs, DVD players)
 - Pedestrian traffic signals
 - Water dispensers
 - Walk-in refrigerators and freezers
 - Evaporative coolers
 - Hot tubs (portable electric spas)
 - Commercial hot food holding cabinets
 - Under-cabinet fluorescent lamps
