Western Beverage, Inc. supports the proposed rule that outlines the alcohol content requirements in order for flavored malt beverages to be classified as beer. Specifically, the Tax and Trade Bureau proposed that for an FMB to be classified as beer, its alcohol content from distilled alcohol cannot exceed 0.5%.

Beer is not a fortified wine. Beer is not distilled spirits, or a product that has been made through the distillation prodess. Beer is a unique product made through the brewing process. Adoption of the TTB "0.5 by volume standard" would ensure the integrity of beer and the brewing process. Beer has always been regulated and taxed differently throughout our nation's history. When Congress first imposed the beer excise tax, back in the 1800's, the distinction and regulatory treatment of beer was based on its production process. If traditional distinctions disappear, soon, other alcohol beverages producers will attempt of categorize their products as "beer".

Again, Western Beverage, Inc. encourages the TTB to give final approval to the proposed 0.5% standard on flavored malt beverages.
