Dear Chief Foster:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau's (TTB's) pending ruling regarding flavored malt beverages Notice No. 4. The Washington State Liquor Control Board supports TTB's proposal to limit the percentage of alcohol that may be derived from flavorings in malt beverages to 0.5% alcohol by volume.

It is important to the Washington State Liquor Control Board and other state liquor authorities that consumers are aware of what they are drinking and its alcohol content. Consumers can only make informed decisions if they have clear and consistent information. The TTB's proposal to place a 0.5% alcohol by volume limit on flavorings that contained spirits and to require alcohol content to be listed on the brand label of flavored malt beverages are reasonable and important requirements that will protect consumers.

Again, we appreciate the opportunity to comment on these important issues and appreciate your consideration. The issues raised in this letter have important policy implications for the states, including issues of consumer protection, taxation, and distribution channels. Addressing these issues at the federal level will ensure consistency and preclude the various states from having to create separate regulations. << 0044517A >>
