





- To see records for journals, books, reports and audiovisuals on order, on loan or in process at the NLM







Digitized historical public health and training films using a prototype full-text search and delivery platform for online motion picture content.



LS: When did you become interested in the research aspects of information science and bibliographic control?

Well, I don't know that I ever was not. To me, research is just another way of looking at the world. 

Access to Audiovisual Materials

The National Library of Medicine (NLM) has over 60,000 audiovisual programs in almost 40 formats. The AV collection is in English and several foreign languages, among them, Spanish, French, German, Russian, Japanese, Chinese, Turkish, and Arabic. Over 6,300 are of historical interest.

Lending Policy

- Most audiovisuals are available for loan to any library in the United States.
- Individuals must borrow these materials through a local library.


