History of the Partners 1995-2003

Origins

On April 20, 1995 the Public Health Service sponsored a conference at the National Library of Medicine (NLM), during which leaders in the National Information Infrastructure (NII) and population health communities came together to explain their work to each other, delineate the barriers that discourage application of NII technologies to the information problems of population-based public health, and lay out a comprehensive strategy for moving forward. Following this conference, the July 1995 report Making a Powerful Connection: the Health of the Public and the National Information Infrastructure¹ called for the Department of Health and Human Services to:

"form a strategic partnership between [the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention] CDC, state and local public health associations, NLM, and the National Network of Libraries of Medicine [NN/LM] to train state and local public health officials in the use of currently available information resources that are applicable to public health."

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
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

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
