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**A BILL**

To prohibit the National Labor Relations Board from ordering any employer to close, relocate, or transfer employment under any circumstance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Jobs From  
5 Government Interference Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORITY OF THE NLRB.**

2 Section 10(c) of the National Labor Relations Act  
3 (29 U.S.C. 160) is amended by inserting before the period  
4 at the end the following: “: *Provided further*, That the  
5 Board shall have no power to order an employer (or seek  
6 an order against an employer) to restore or reinstate any  
7 work, product, production line, or equipment, to rescind  
8 any relocation, transfer, subcontracting, outsourcing, or  
9 other change regarding the location, entity, or persons who  
10 shall be engaged in production or other business oper-  
11 ations, or to require any employer to make an initial or  
12 additional investment at a particular plant, facility, or lo-  
13 cation.”.

14 **SEC. 3. RETROACTIVITY.**

15 The Act shall apply to any complaint for which a final  
16 adjudication by the Board has not been made by the date  
17 of enactment.
