Examples of Implementation Plan Actions

- Strengthen interagency collaboration to protect and conserve coral reef ecosystems.
- Reduce rural sources of excessive nutrients, sediments, toxics, and pathogens
- Reduce vulnerability to climate change
- Locate, control, and eradicate invasive species
- Strengthen and integrate ocean observations
