<sup>1</sup> PL 90-130 of 8 November 1967 authorized the enlistment and appointment of women (WAFs) in the ANG other than nurses. Because of required planning lead time, the TAGs were not authorized to begin accessioning WAFs into the ANG until 1 July 1968.

<sup>2</sup> The large increase in ANG end strength in FY 1963 was primarily due to the demobilization of Air Guardsmen who had been called up during the Berlin crisis.

<sup>3</sup> Did not include the 21,067 Air Guardsmen mobilized for the Berlin crisis.

<sup>4</sup> PL 845, 84<sup>th</sup> Congress, authorized female reserve officers of the Army and Air Force to be appointed as nurses or women medical specialists in the Army or Air National Guard (Ann Rpt CNGB FY 57, p. 4.) It would be the first time in the history of the National Guard or militia that women served legally as members of those organization. The first woman to actually join the National Guard was Capt. Norma Parsons Erb, a nurse who joined the New York ANG in October 1956.
