This company is in the business of importing bicycles from Japan.

At this time, we have in our inventory many bicycles that were ordered prior the publication of the new regulations in the Federal Register on July 16, 1974.

It is our understanding that those bicycles that were imported into the United States prior to the effective date of the new regulations, (ie. 1/1/75) are not considered to be "banned" under the regulations and may move freely in interstate commerce.

Since any errors on our part, would be disastrous to our business we are requesting an official statement from your office verifying our understanding.
