

Brad King

Brad King is a native of the tiny community of Omega, in Hamilton County, Indiana (population 50), where “mayor” is an honorary title, not an elected office. He received his B.A. in History and Political Science (with honors) from Indiana University, and his J.D. from the College of William and Mary, in Williamsburg, Virginia.

Brad served as Senior Staff Attorney, Legislative Services Agency (and counsel to the Indiana House and Senate Elections Committees). He was then Assistant Corporation Counsel for the City of Indianapolis, and counsel to the Marion County Board of Voter Registration.

For seven years, he was Co-General Counsel to the Indiana State Election Board, and then State Elections Director for the Secretary of State of Minnesota. Since 2002, he has served as Co-Director of the Election Division of the Office of the Secretary of State of Indiana.

He is currently President of the National Association of State Election Directors, and serves as Chairman of the United States Election Assistance Commission Standards Board, which advises federal election officials regarding standards for voting machines.

Brad is a member of the Bar of the State of California, the State of Indiana, and the United States Supreme Court.

For the last 25 years, he has had the privilege of advising and assisting county election officials, candidates, and political party officials throughout Indiana, and but still encounters new and challenging questions during each election cycle.
