**UOCAVA**, or the *Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act* of 1986, as amended by the *MOVE Act*, requires U.S. States and territories to allow certain U.S. citizens to apply to register and vote absentee in elections for federal office.

Citizens covered under UOCAVA include:

- Members of the Uniformed Services or Merchant Marine who are absent from their voting jurisdiction due to their service.
- 2. Dependents of members of the Uniformed Services or Merchant Marine who are absent from their voting jurisdiction with the member.
- 3. U.S. citizens residing outside the United States and its territories.



The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) provides assistance to both *UOCAVA* citizens and election officials and is your primary resource for information on *UOCAVA*.

### FVAP's purpose is to:

- Assist uniformed services and overseas voters to exercise their right to vote and have an equal opportunity with the general population to have their vote counted.
- Assist the States in complying with relevant federal laws, and advise them on ways to best comply.
- Advocate on behalf of the Uniformed Services and overseas voters, identifying impediments to their ability to exercise their right to vote, and proposing methods to overcome those impediments.





### Challenges to UOCAVA Voting Success



### Tackling Challenge 1: Current Address



**1. Mobile Population:** *UOCAVA* citizens tend to move frequently.



**2. Complex Process:** Variability in State voting procedures adds complexity.



**3. Time Required:** Delays in overseas mail reduce the time available to vote.


## Tackling Challenge 2: Online Assistants

Challenge 2: Variability in State voting procedures and requirements creates additional complexity for UOCAVA voters.



Benefits of the Online Assistants:

- 1. Generate only State-required fields.
- Provide up-to-date information such as important State voting deadlines.
- 3. Provide an output package that allows voters to print, sign, and send their completed form or ballot.
- Streamline voting process so no stage takes more than 15 minutes to complete.





## Challenge 3: Time Required

**Challenge 3:** Delays in postal mail make it challenging for overseas voters to receive, vote, and return their ballots in time to be counted



Tackling Challenge 3: Time Required **Electronic Transmission Service** 

FVAP provides an Electronic Transmission Service (ETS) that allows UOCAVA balloting materials to be faxed at no cost.\*

Here's how it works:

### You fax to FVAP

Toll-free fax a ballot and cover sheet to FVAP at 1-800-368-8683.

### **FVAP** forwards to voter

FVAP forwards the ballot to the voter. FVAP provides a fax-to-email conversion if the voter only has email access.

### Voter faxes to FVAP

The voter completes the ballot and returns it to FVAP via email or toll-free fax.

**FVAP** faxes to you FVAP faxes the ballot back to you for

processing.
