► THIS WEEK IN AIR FORCE HISTORY

September 25, 1918 - Lt. Edward V. Richenbacker attacked seven German aircraft near Billy, France, while on a voluntary patrol. Despite the odds, he dived on them, shot one of the Fokkers out of control, then attacked one of the Halkberstadts and shot it down. For this action, he received the Medal of Honor.

September 26, 1971 - Air Weather Service WC-130s dropped silver iodide into Hurricane Ginger to decrease the storm's intensity. It was the service's first hurricane seeding attempt.

September 27, 1993 - Gen. James H. Doolittle, who led the first air raid on Tokyo and commanded the Eighth Air Force during World War II, dies at the age of 96.

September 28, 1912 - Cpl. Frank S. Scott became the first enlisted fatality in Signal Corps Aviation.

September 29, 1964 - The first of 36 Minuteman II launches occurred at Cape Kennedy, Fla. In this flight, the missile successfully delivered its payload nearly 5,000 miles downrange on target.

September 30, 1949 - The Berlin airlift, gradually reduced since May 12, officially ended. Allied aircraft carried 2,343,301.5 tons of supplies on 277,264 flights. U.S. planes carried 1,783,826 tons.

October 1, 1969 - The C-5A Galaxy, world's largest aircraft at the time, took off from Edwards AFB, Calif., with a 410,000-payload, the heaviest ever carried by any aircraft. This load was also 21,000 pounds heavier than the C-5A's designed lift capability, and 28,100 pounds heavier than the record it set on June 15.
