CHILD CARE

Many of today's military families rely on quality child care as an important part of their support network. Parents want their children to be safe, happy, and healthy while they are in the care of others. Military spouses often work outside the home, continue their education, and play the role of single parent due to frequent deployments. DoD and the branches of Service are constantly reviewing and initiating programs to provide military families and their children with the best possible child care options.
