

Peace Corps service is a life-defining leadership experience. Peace Corps Volunteers live, learn, and work with a community overseas for 27 months, providing technical assistance in six program areas: education, youth and community development, health, business and information and communications technology, agriculture, and environment. We are looking for applicants with a variety of skills and are actively recruiting to reflect the diversity of America. Peace Corps prepares Volunteers with language, cross-cultural, and technical training.

We recommend you submit your application as early as possible so we can match your skills to openings as they become available. Plan ahead and apply nine months to a year in advance of your target departure date. To be eligible for Peace Corps service, you must be at least 18 years of age and a U.S. citizen.

Business and Information & Communication Technology Volunteers

Peace Corps Volunteers help strengthen infrastructure and encourage economic opportunities in communities overseas. Volunteers support communities through business development and advising, urban and regional planning, and computer science.

Business Programs and Sample Projects

Business Advising

- · Teach business courses and English
- Train and advise communities in business planning, marketing, financial management, and product design
- Develop and write project funding proposals and assist with microfinance programs

Nongovernmental Organization Development

 Train rural groups and local leaders to build organizational capacity through improved leadership and communications skills

- Help identify sources of program funding and other support and assist with grant proposal preparation
- Help local entities with strategic planning and program assessment and promote active community participation

Business Development

- Consult with local businesses and conduct seminars on starting a business, strategic planning, marketing, merchandising, organizational development, and tourism development
- Develop business education curriculum, design training materials, and work with women and minority groups to strengthen their participation in the economic system

Urban and Regional Planning

- Assess the impact of planned activities or economic and environmental development on communities
- Assist in infrastructure planning for primary and secondary cities
- · Assist with the creation and control of project budgets
