WINTER PREPAREDNESS

In preparation for the winter season and possibly another round of influenza, WHS has some safety tips for being 'winter prepared'. Simple steps to keeping you and your family safe and healthy during this season include being informed, making a plan and having a winter preparedness kit.

Be Informed. Know the weather conditions in your area. During inclement weather, check local radio and television stations for closings. Sign up for free emergency alerts through your applicable county if the service is available.



Make a plan. Develop a plan in the event of inclement weather in your area. Have emergency contact and utility company information easily accessible. Discuss the plan with your family. For information on developing a preparedness plan, visit www.ready.gov or www.redcross.org.

- ✓ Food and water (enough for 3 days per person)
- ✓ Flashlights, battery powered radio and extra batteries
- ✓ Shovel/road salt

- ✓ First Aid Kit
- ✓ Medication(s)
- ✓ Blankets and warm clothing
- ✓ Supplies for special members of the household (infants, elderly, pets, etc)
