What Is the Chapter 31 Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Program?

This program's primary function is to help veterans who have service-connected disabilities become suitably employed, maintain employment, or achieve independence in daily living.

Who is Eligible for VR&E Services?

To receive an evaluation for vocational rehabilitation services, a veteran must:

- Have received, or eventually receive, an honorable or other than dishonorable discharge
- Have a VA service-connected disability rating of 10% or more



You can apply through the Internet for VR&E benefits by going to the VONAPP web site at: <http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp>

The VONAPP (Veterans On Line Applications) website is an official U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) website. You can apply for VA benefits using the Internet. U.S. military members who are within six months of separation or pension, and vocational rehabilitation.

When you use this site to complete an application, the application will be sent directly to the VA office. Processing will begin and you will receive a response from the VA office letting you know that it received your application.

Just click on the website and the VONAPP process will appear. VONAPP requires that the User create a User ID and password.





Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Service provides vocational-educational counseling to veterans and certain dependents. Eligibility for this service is based on having eligibility for a VA Education program such as: Chapter 30 (Montgomery GI Bill); Chapter 32 (Veterans Education Assistance Program - VEAP); Chapter 35 (Dependents Education Assistance Program) for certain spouses and dependent children; Chapter 18 (Spina Bifida Program) for certain dependent children; Chapter 1606 (Reservists Education Program); Public Law 102-16 (for Transitioning Service members).

What Does Partnership Mean to VR&E?

Partnership between the Department of Veterans Affairs and Department of Labor exists on a national as well as local level. VR&E Service and Veterans Employment and Training Service (VETS) work together in partnership to provide direct job service to Ch31 participants.

The Department of Veterans Affairs and Department of Defense formed a close partnership in 1991 that addresses the adjustment needs of disabled service men and women through the Disabled Transition Assistance Program (DTAP). This partnership affords disabled servicemembers access to VR&E at an early point of transition from military to civilian occupations.

The Compensated Work Therapy Program of Veterans Health Administration and VR&E partnership works by bringing transitional and permanent jobs to veterans who may be returning to the workforce following medical rehabilitation.
