**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION  
of the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress<sup>1</sup>**

**Bill No. and sponsor:** H.R. 4479 (Mr. Joe Courtney of Connecticut).

**Proponent name,<sup>3</sup> location:** Warren Corporation, Stafford Springs, CT.

**Other bills on product (110<sup>th</sup> Congress only):** None.

**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

**Retroactive effect:** None.

**Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):**

Waste of camel hair (provided for in subheading 5103.20.00).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

This bill covers waste of camel hair, which is a by-product of carding, a step in processing fibers into yarn. Camel hair waste is typically blended with other fibers, such as wool or cashmere, and spun into blended yarns. Waste of camel hair is provided for in HTS subheading 5103.20.00, which covers waste, except noils, of all wool or fine animal hair. U.S. imports under HTS subheading 5103.20.00 totaled \$1.2 million in 2007. The United Kingdom was the primary supplier of such waste in 2007, followed by India,<sup>4</sup> China, and Canada.

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## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on waste of  
camel hair.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. WASTE OF CAMEL HAIR.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.12.21 of the Har-  
5       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
6       by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

7       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
8       subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or  
9       withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after  
10      the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
