**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

5-Chloro-3-hydroxy-2-methoxy-2-naphthanilide (CAS No. 137-52-0) (provided for in subheading 2924.29.36).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as an intermediate in the production of organic pigments. It is imported from China and India.<sup>4</sup>

## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 5-Chloro-3-hydroxy-2-methoxy-2-naphthanilide.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 5-CHLORO-3-HYDROXY-2-METHOXY-2-NAPH-**  
4 **THANILIDE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.23.58 of the Har-  
6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
7 by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
9 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
