Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic compound that is used in the herbicide Basagran which is used for selective post-emergent control of many broadleaf weeds and sedges.⁴ The imported technical product is formulated into a liquid product that is distributed in the United States and Canada. The subject product is imported from Germany.

- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
- 6 by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/31/2011".
- 7 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 8 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
- 9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 10 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
