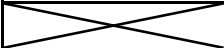
Pigment Red 187 (CAS No. 59487-23-9) (provided for in subheading 3204.17.60).

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used in coloring plastics that are processed at over 200°C. It has FDA approval for indirect food contact packaging. The subject product is imported from Germany.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PIGMENT RED 187.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Heading 9902.32.22 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Pigment Red 187) is amended by striking “12/31/2009”
7 and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
