**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

**Retroactive effect:** None.

**Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):**

(S)-3-allyl-2-methyl-4-oxocyclopent-2-enyl(1R,3R)-2,2-dimethyl-3-(2-methylprop-1-enyl)cyclopropanecarboxylate (S-Bioallethrin) (CAS No. 28434-00-6) (provided for in subheading 2916.20.50).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject synthetic organic chemical is an insecticide with a broad spectrum of activity against most flying and crawling insects. S-Bioallethrin can be used alone in formulated products as the sole active ingredient, or combined with other insecticides to good effect. The product is imported from Japan.

**Technical comments:**<sup>4</sup>

The Commission staff suggests that the article description of HTS heading 9902.24.33 be modified as shown on page 1 of this report in order to provide a better representation of the chemical name.

In addition, the Commission staff notes that H.R. 5020 and H.R. 5021 cover product isomers of bioallethrin. For the purposes of Customs administration, a single HTS heading could be drafted to provide for a duty suspension on S-bioallethrin and bioallethrin, the product isomer covered by H.R. 5020, which would ease some administrative burdens with Customs.

<sup>4</sup> The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on S-  
Bioallethrin.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. S-BIOALLETHRIN.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.24.33 of the Har-  
5       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
6       by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

7       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
8       subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or  
9       withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after  
10      the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
