Bill No. and sponsor: H.R. 5068 (Mr. Joe Sestak of Pennsylvania).

Proponent name,³ location: United Phosphorus, Inc., King of Prussia, PA.

Other bills on product (110th Congress only): None.

Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Methyl sulfanilylcarbamate, sodium salt (asulam sodium salt) (CAS No. 2302-17-2) imported in bulk form (provided for in subheading 2935.00.75), or imported in forms or packings for retail sale or mixed with application adjuvants (provided for in subheading 3808.93.15).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is used as a postemergence herbicide to control weeds in sugarcane fields, Christmas tree plantings, turf, and other non-crop areas. The product is imported from the United Kingdom.

3 **SECTION 1. ASULAM SODIUM SALT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.02.87 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Methyl sulfanilylcarbamate, sodium salt (asulam sodium
7 salt)) is amended by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting
8 “12/31/2011”.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
