3 **SECTION 1. CHEMICAL THAT IS USED FOR DYEING AP-**
4 **PAREL HOME TEXTILES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:
