**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**


This synthetic organic chemical, sodium methyl sulfanylcarbamate (Asulam), is a white crystalline product used as a postemergence herbicide to control weeds in sugarcane fields, Christmas tree plantings, turf, and other non-crop areas. Currently, there is no U.S. production of this product. This product is imported from the United Kingdom as a formulation and then packaged for sale in the domestic market.

There is one postemergence herbicide that competes with Asulam in most areas, especially sugar cane and turf. This product is also imported and then packaged or further formulated for sale in the domestic market.

## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Asulam  
sodium salt.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. ASULAM SODIUM SALT.**

4       (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Heading 9902.01.50 of the Har-  
5       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
6       by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/2008”.

7       (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
8       subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from  
9       warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
10      the date of enactment of this Act.
