*o*-Anisidine is a synthetic organic chemical used by the importer in the manufacture of diketene derivatives in the Eastman Chemical plant in Kingsport, Tennessee. The diketene derivatives are in turn used to produce pigments. This orange to brown powder is imported from China.

However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

To suspend temporarily the duty on Anisidine.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. O-ANISIDINE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
7 new heading:
