Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The product, a synthetic organic chemical used to produce zeta-cypermethrin, an insecticide applied to crops such as cotton and a variety of vegetables, is not produced in the United States. The chemical is imported from the United Kingdom. Although zeta-cypermethrin is considered competitive with lambda–cyhalothrin (Syngenta), the two products are reportedly not perfect substitutes.
