3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON SODIUM ORTHO-**
4 **PHENYLPHENOL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:

“	9902.39.14	Sodium ortho-phenylphenol (CAS No. 132-27-4) (pro- vided for in subheading 2907.19.80)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2009	”.
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1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn
3 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
