N-(Phenylmethyl)-1H-purine-6-amine is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as a plant growth regulator. The product is used to improve the size and quality of fruit and other crops. Switzerland is the largest source of imports under HTS subheading 2933.59.15.

The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
