3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN COMPOUNDS OF LANTHANUM**
4 **PHOSPHATES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:
