Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

Avermectin B is a class of insecticidal/miticidal compounds that are derived from the soil bacterium streptomyces avermitilis. Avermectin B is a natural fermentation product of this bacterium. Avermectin B is used to control insects and mite pests of citrus, pear, and nut tree crops, and it is used by homeowners for the control of fire ants. The subject product is imported from Switzerland.
