**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN
INITIAL DETERMINATION TERMINATING TWO RESPONDENTS
ON THE BASIS OF A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND LICENSE AGREEMENT**

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 8) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) in the above-captioned investigation terminating two respondents on the basis of a settlement agreement and license agreement.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on July 5, 2007, under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, based on a complaint filed by Sidel Participations of France, Sidel Canada Inc. of Canada, and Sidel Inc. of Norcross, Georgia. Complainants supplemented their complaint on June 18, 2007. The respondents named in the complaint are Kronos AG and KHS AG of Germany; Kronos Inc., of Franklin, Wisconsin; and KHS USA, Inc. of Waukesha, Wisconsin. The complaint, as

supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain buffer systems and components thereof used in container processing lines by reason of infringement of U.S. Patent No. 6,168,005. The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists in the United States as required by subsection (a)(2) of section 337. The complainants request that the Commission issue a general exclusion order and cease and desist orders.

On August 30, 2007, respondents Krones AG and Krones, Inc. (collectively, "Krones") filed a motion to terminate the investigation on the basis of a settlement agreement and license agreement. The Commission investigative attorney supported the motion, but complainants opposed the motion.

On September 27, 2007, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting Krones' motion and terminating the investigation with respect to Krones on the basis of the settlement and license agreements. No petitions for review were filed and the Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

This action is taken under the authority of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and Commission rules 210.21, 210.42, 19 C.F.R. §§ 210.21, 210.42.
