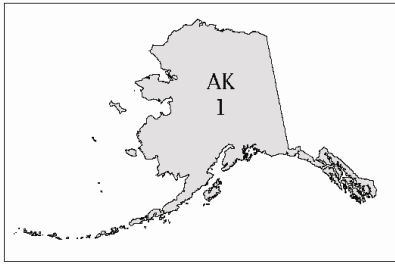

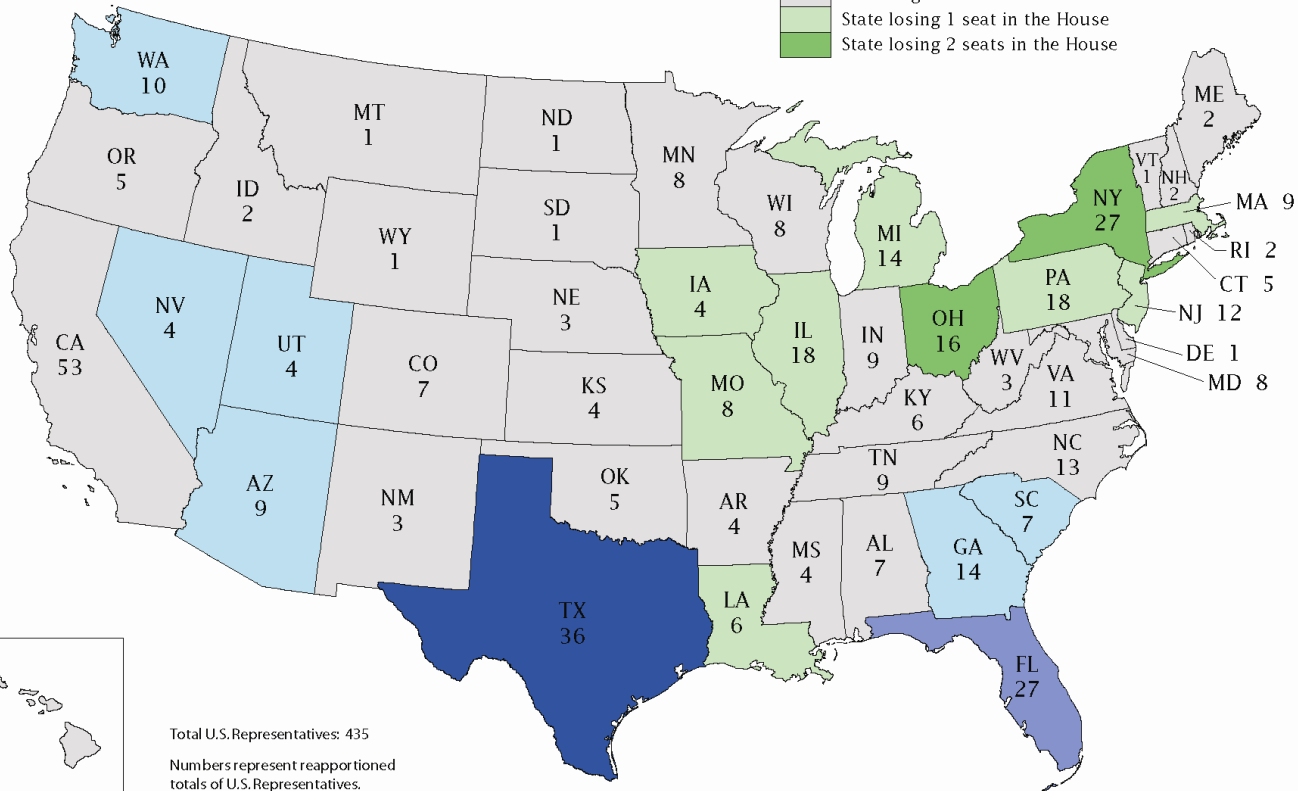

The 2010 Census

A Portrait of America

- Required by the U.S. Constitution
 - Article 1, Section 2
 - Decennial Census every 10 years
- On December 21, 2010, the first results of the 2010 Census were released providing each state with their resident population and number of representatives

2010 Census Data A Portrait of America

- Redistricting data are used to redraw congressional and legislative boundaries
- County and city governments use census data to redraw the boundaries of local political subdivisions such as city councils, city wards, school assignment areas and even voting districts, to name a few

2010 Census Data A Portrait of America

- TIGER/Line geographic shape files were shipped on a state-by-state basis to officials through the end of January 2011.
- The P.L. 94-171 redistricting data files will begin flowing on a state-by-state basis in early February 2011.

2010 Census Data

A Portrait of America

- P.L. 94-171 redistricting data files are delivered to all states no later than March 31, 2011.
- Data include five simple tables:
 - Total Population
 - Total Population by Race
 - Ethnicity (Hispanic/Latino origin)
 - Voting Age (18 and over)
 - Housing unit status (vacant and occupied)

2010 Census Data A Portrait of America Process for Data Delivery

The law requires the data to be delivered in a non-partisan manner:

The Census Bureau ships to governors, majority and minority leaders of both political parties, as well as commission directors (when we know who they are), and redistricting committees (when we know who they are) at the same time.

2010 Census Data A Portrait of America Data For American Indian Areas

As we ship data to each state we will simultaneously issue an alert to:

- All land-based American Indian Reservations
- Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas
- Alaska Native Regional Corporations
- Oklahoma Tribal Statistical Areas

2010 Census Data A Portrait of America Process for Delivery

- Census Bureau will ship Monday thru Thursday to state leadership.
- Census Bureau will confirm bi-partisan receipt Tuesday thru Friday.
- Census Bureau will deploy data to the American Fact Finder for public access following confirmation and within 24 hours Wednesday through Saturday.

- Delivery of TIGER Shapefiles – November 2010-January 2011
- First peek at 2010 tabulation blocks/census tracts and block groups
- Shapefiles will be posted on GEO homepage
- RDO homepage will post links to all redistricting data including the geo products

 - TIGER/Line® Shapefiles are spatial extracts from the Census Bureau's MAF/TIGER database, containing features such as roads, railroads, rivers, as well as legal and statistical geographic areas.
 - TIGER/Line® Shapefiles are designed for use with geographic information system (GIS) software. The TIGER/Line® Shapefiles do not include demographic data, but they contain geographic entity codes that can be linked to the Census Bureau's demographic data.
- **2010 Census Redistricting Maps**
 - The 2010 Census Redistricting Maps are a comprehensive series of maps that may assist you in your work with the Summary Files.
- **2010 Census Block Assignment Files**
 - The 2010 Census Block Assignment Files contain statewide 2010 Census tabulation block listings for a series of geographies.
 - The Name Look-up tables provide a listing of those geographies by code and name.

2010 Census Block Assignment Files

The 2010 Census Block Assignment Files and Name Look-up tables will be posted, by state, starting in mid-February, 2011. The Block Assignment Files will be generated for the following geographies:

- Congressional Districts
- State Legislative Districts
- Voting Districts
- School Districts
 - Elementary
 - Secondary
 - Unified
- Incorporated Places + Census Defined Places
- American Indian/Alaska Native/Hawaiian Homeland Areas

There will be one Name Look-up table generated for each level of geography with the exception of the Incorporated Place + Census Defined Place table. For that geography there will be two Name Look-up tables generated, one for Incorporated Places and another for Census Defined Places.

2010 Census Block Relationship Files
