BRIGADIER GENERAL JEREMIAH P. HOLLAND AWARD

Effective 1 March 1977

Local limited supplementation of this regulation is permitted but is not required. If supplements are issued, Army Staff agencies and major Army commands will furnish one copy of each to HQDA (DAPE-HRE), Washington, DC 20310; other commands will furnish one copy of each to the next higher headquarters.

APPENDIX A. (

1. General. The Brigadier General Jeremiah P. Holland Award will be given annually to the most outstanding military police unit, company size or smaller.

B. Unit Descriptive Data.

- 2. Description. This award will be an appropriate trophy, of a design selected by the Chief, Law Enforcement Division, ODCSPER, HQDA.
- 3. Eligibility. Active Army military police units, company size or smaller, are eligible to receive this award.
- 4. Selection. a. The Chief, Law Enforcement Division, will chair a board of military police officers at HQDA level to determine which military police unit will receive the annual award.
- b. Selection will be based on total accomplishments of the unit, encompassing every phase of activity bearing directly on mission accomplishment.
- c. Selection will be made so as to preclude the necessity for additional records, exercises, or inspections.
- (1) Selection will be based on records, reports, and significant accomplishments of the unit.
- (2) The following records and reports, when appropriate to the type unit being evaluated, will be considered: Annual General Inspection Report, ARTEP, other appropriate inspections/tests, weapons qualification scores, skill qualification test scores, reenlistment rate, individual awards, decorations and citations originating outside the

- nominated unit, and other major accomplishments, significant achievements or extracurricular activities.
- 5. Procedures. a. Units will be considered based on performance for the period 1 October through 30 September.
- Each major command reporting directly to Headquarters, Department of the Army, may annually submit one nomination for consideration. Nominations will be forwarded to HQDA (DAPEHRE), WASH DC 20310 so as to arrive not later than 15 November.
- c. Nominations will be forwarded by cover letter with three inclosures. Inclosure 1 (general data) must be in the suggested format as shown in appendix A. Inclosure 2 (unit descriptive data) must be in the suggested format as shown in appendix B. Inclosure 3 will be a copy of the latest AGI report. The provisions of paragraphs 1-10 and 1-11, AR 20-1 concerning the proper handling and the release and use of Inspector General reports apply; release within DA for official purposes is authorized when approved by AGI directing authority. The nomination format provides adequate descriptive data and eliminates bulky eyewash-oriented submissions Accomplishments, not quantity of submission data, will be the primary selection consideration.

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- 6. Announcement/presentation. a. The award will be announced not later than 15 December and presented in an appropriate local ceremony.
- b. Law Enforcement Division will notify the major commander of the selected unit of arrangements for delivery of the award.
