Strings, Cords and Necklaces Can Strangle Infants

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has received reports of infants who were strangled by strings, cords, ribbons, or necklaces around their necks.

The string, cord, or necklace can become caught on a product, such as a crib or play yard, or it can become tightly wrapped or twisted around a child's neck.

Never tie pacifiers, necklaces, toys, or other items around a child's neck. Never leave cords of any kind near an infant. Take off bibs or other clothing tied around a child's neck before putting the child in a crib or play yard.
