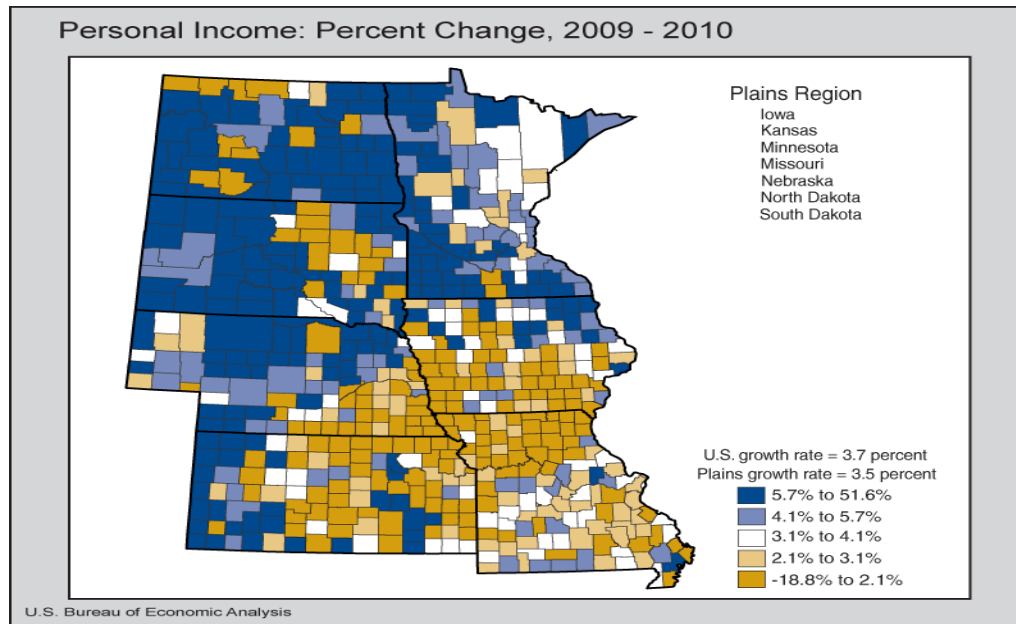


Local Area Personal Income: Plains Region, 2010

- The Plains region accounted for 7 percent of the nation's personal income in 2010. Plains' per capita personal income, \$39,390, was 99 percent of the national average, \$39,937.



In the Plains region in 2010:

- Personal income grew in 533 of 618 counties. The largest growth occurred in Hyde County, South Dakota (51.6 percent), while the largest contraction occurred in Hand County, South Dakota (-18.8 percent).
- Net earnings comprised 65 percent of personal income, while property income contributed 17 percent and transfer receipts made up 18 percent.
- Per capita personal income increased in 530 of 618 counties. Sully County, South Dakota had the highest per capita personal income at \$80,165, while McPherson County, Nebraska had the lowest per capita personal income at \$19,800.
