Incumbent is responsible for reaching an independent conclusion as to an appropriate level of care according to American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) criteria. Incumbent uses highly developed professional skills to perform all clinical services and make decisions regarding diagnosis, level of care, and treatment planning. The incumbent formulates diagnostic impressions for substance abuse disorders, personality disorders, etc., according to the latest edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders. Incumbent evaluates and makes professional judgments and decisions for situations that require immediate crisis intervention. The incumbent makes appropriate referrals to a wide range of military and community services as needed. The incumbent carries full professional responsibility for cases presenting a wide range of psychosocial and environmental problems with no limitations as to the difficulty of services that are performed. The incumbent must be proficient in admission, continued stay, and discharge criteria according to the ASAM model of treatment. The incumbent provides individual and group counseling to patients and their spouses. Incumbent is responsible for identifying and implementing a treatment plan to address bio-psycho-social needs of the patient. The incumbent is responsible for independently giving interpretations of case histories and presenting case progress at Interdisciplinary Patient Review Team, to reach decisions as to medical, correctional, and psychological/psychiatric recommendations. The incumbent teaches didactic classes to address a wide array of medical and psychosocial aspects for patient education. The incumbent is responsible for all patient recordkeeping in accordance with Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHO) and all military regulations and standards of recordkeeping. The incumbent is one of the Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program (SARP) staff recognized as a substance abuse expert for the spouse and child abuse Case Review Committee. The incumbent must remain current and knowledgeable in the field of substance abuse, dual diagnosis, ethics, HIV/AIDS, and other areas to be able to provide therapeutic services.

At least 51% of the incumbent's time will be spent on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management.
