Work shift is daytime, Monday through Friday, but maintaining workload sometimes requires evening hours. On-call can be expected once every four to seven weeks. Assistance on Air Force-specific instructions/protocols will be given, but a strong clinical base with adult mental health is necessary.

This position requires a Secret clearance.

At least 51% of the incumbent's time will be spent on direct mental health patient care and/or mental health clinical management.
