- 9 provisions addressed in Notices of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRMs) to issue on 12 Month Timeline
 - 4 NPRMs issued on January 5-6, 2012
 - 5 NPRMs and 1 Guidance Document to issue in late January 2012
- 2 provisions in progress on 17 Month Timeline
- 2 provisions to begin work on 18 Month Timeline*



 - Authority to be exercised by rulemaking
- 2. Micro-entity
 - Status effective on September 16, 2011
 - 75% discount is not available until USPTO exercises fee setting authority



17 Month Timeline


