GENERAL INFORMATION

Background.---These investigations were instituted in response to a petition filed on October 31, 2006 by NewPage Corporation, Dayton, OH. Countervailing and/or antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these investigations if the Commission makes affirmative determinations of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce makes affirmative determinations of subsidization and/or dumping.

Additional questionnaires will be supplied promptly upon request, or photocopies of the enclosed questionnaire(s) may be used. Address all correspondence to the United States International Trade Commission, Washington, DC 20436. Hearing-impaired individuals can obtain information regarding these investigations via the Commission's TDD terminal (202-205-1810).

<u>Due date of questionnaire(s)</u>.--Return the completed questionnaire(s) to the United States International Trade Commission by no later than **August 7**, **2007**. Use of an overnight mail service may be necessary to ensure that your response actually reaches the Commission by **August 7**, **2007**. Please make sure the completed questionnaire is sent to the attention of **Debra Baker**. Return <u>only one</u> copy of the completed questionnaire(s), but please keep a copy for your records so that you can refer to it if the Commission staff contacts you with any questions during the course of the investigations.

<u>Service of questionnaire response(s)</u>.--In the event that your firm is a party to the investigations, you are required to serve a copy of the questionnaire(s), once completed, on parties to the proceeding that are subject to administrative protective order (see 19 CFR § 207.7). A list of such parties is maintained by the Commission's Secretary and may be obtained by calling 202-205-1803. A certificate of service must accompany the copy of the completed questionnaire(s) you submit (see 19 CFR § 207.7).

<u>Confidentiality</u>.--The commercial and financial data furnished in response to the enclosed questionnaire(s) that reveal the individual operations of your firm will be treated as confidential by the Commission to the extent that such data are not otherwise available to the public and will not be disclosed except as may be required by law (see 19 U.S.C. § 1677f). Such confidential information will not be published in a manner that will reveal the individual operations of your firm; however, nonnumerical characterizations of numerical business proprietary information (such as discussion of trends) will be treated as confidential business information only at the request of the submitter for good cause shown.

Verification.--The information submitted in the enclosed questionnaire(s) is subject to audit and verification by the Commission. To facilitate possible verification of data, please keep all your workpapers and supporting documents used in the preparation of the questionnaire response(s).

<u>**Release of information.</u></u>--The information provided by your firm in response to the questionnaire(s), as well as any other business proprietary information submitted by your firm to the Commission in connection with the investigations, may become subject to, and released under, the administrative protective order provisions of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1677f) and section 207.7 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR § 207.7). This means that certain lawyers and other authorized individuals may temporarily be given access to the information for use in connection with these investigations or other importingury investigations conducted by the Commission on the same or similar merchandise; those individuals would be subject to severe penalties if the information were divulged to unauthorized individuals.</u>**

INSTRUCTIONS

<u>Consolidate all establishments in China, Indonesia, and/or Korea (i.e., the subject countries)</u> <u>and each nonsubject country</u>.--Report the requested data for your establishment(s) located in each of the countries for which you are reporting. Firms operating more than one establishment in any one country should combine the data for all establishments into a single report for that country. If your firm produces **coated free sheet paper** in more than one country, prepare a separate questionnaire response for each country.

<u>Answer all questions</u>.--Do not leave any question or section blank unless a questionnaire expressly directs you to skip over certain questions or sections. If the answer to any question is "none," write "none." If information is not readily available from your records in exactly the form requested, furnish carefully prepared estimates--designated as such by the letter "E"--and explain the basis of your estimates. Answers to questions and any necessary comments or explanations should be supplied in the space provided or on separate sheets attached to the appropriate page of the questionnaire(s). If your firm is completing more than one questionnaire in connection with these investigations (i.e., a producer, importer, purchaser, and/or foreign producer questionnaire), you need not respond to duplicated questions in the questionnaires.

DEFINITIONS

<u>Coated free sheet paper</u> (or "subject merchandise").–Coated free sheet paper and paperboard of a kind used for writing, printing or other graphic purposes (hereinafter "coated free sheet paper"). Coated free sheet paper is produced from not-more-than 10 percent by weight mechanical or combined chemical/mechanical fibers. Coated free sheet paper is coated with kaolin (China clay) or other inorganic substances, with or without a binder, and with no other coating. Coated free sheet paper may be surface-colored, surface-decorated, printed (except as described below), embossed, or perforated. The subject merchandise includes single- and double-side-coated free sheet paper; coated free sheet paper in both sheet or roll form; and is inclusive of all weights, brightness levels, and finishes. The terms "wood free" or "art" paper may also be used to describe the imported product.

The subject merchandise <u>does not</u> include (a) coated free sheet paper that is imported printed with final content printed text or graphics; (b) base paper to be sensitized for use in photography; or (c) paper containing by weight 25 percent or more cotton fiber.

Imports of the subject merchandise are provided for under the following statistical categories of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States: 4810.13.1900; 4810.13.2010; 4810.13.2090; 4810.13.5000; 4810.13.7040; 4810.14.1900; 4810.14.2010; 4810.14.2090; 4810.14.5000; 4810.14.7040; 4810.19.1900; 4810.19.2010; and 4810.19.2090. While HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes, the written description of the scope of this investigation is dispositive.

<u>Firm</u>.--An individual proprietorship, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation (including any subsidiary corporation), business trust, cooperative, trustee in bankruptcy, or receiver under decree of any court.

<u>**Related firm.</u></u>--A firm that your firm solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled; a firm that solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled your firm; and/or a firm that was solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled by a firm that also solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled by a firm that also solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled your firm.</u>**

Establishment.--Each facility of a firm in the country(ies) for which you are reporting involved in the production of **coated free sheet paper** (as defined above), including auxiliary facilities operated in conjunction with (whether or not physically separate from) such facilities.

<u>United States</u>.--For purposes of these investigations, the 50 States, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia.

DEFINITIONS--Continued

Importer.--Any person or firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in importing **coated free sheet paper** (as defined above) into the United States from a foreign manufacturer or through its selling agent. In those instances where a broker or freight forwarder enters the goods (and is listed as the "importer" on Customs documentation), the importer is, for the purposes of this questionnaire, defined to include the consignee.

Average production capacity.--The level of production that your establishment(s) could reasonably have expected to attain during the specified periods. Assume normal operating conditions (i.e., using equipment and machinery in place and ready to operate; normal operating levels (hours per week/weeks per year) and time for downtime, maintenance, repair, and cleanup; and a typical or representative product mix).

<u>Production</u>.--All production in your establishment(s) in the country(ies) for which you are reporting, including production consumed internally within your firm.

Shipments.--Shipments of products produced in your establishment(s) in the country(ies) for which you are reporting. Quantities reported should be net of returns.

<u>Home market commercial shipments</u>.--Shipments, other than internal consumption and transfers to related firms, within the country(ies) for which you are reporting.

Home market internal consumption/transfers to related firms.--Shipments made to related firms in the country(ies) for which you are reporting, including product consumed internally by your firm.

Export shipments.--Shipments to destinations outside the country(ies) for which you are reporting, including shipments to related firms.

Inventories. -- Finished goods inventory, not raw materials or work-in-progress.
