## Geographic Distribution

The Class of 2012 entered West Point with 1,292 new cadets, including 1,278 United States citizens and 14 international cadets. Cadets were nominated by Congress from each of the 50 United States, as well as from military service sources. Twentyseven combat veterans entered West Point with the Class of 2012.

The international cadets are from the countries of Taiwan, Korea, Columbia, Jordan, Romania, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Singapore, Paraguay, Slovenia, Serbia, Lithuania and El Salvador. Upon graduation, those cadets will return to their countries as officers in their respective armed forces.

## Qualifications

To be considered for admission to West Point, you must be a citizen of the United States; be at least 17 but not yet 23 years old on July 1 of the year you enter the Academy; be unmarried, and have no legal obligation to support a child or children.

You must also complete academic (SAT and/or ACT, including the optional writing portion), fitness and medical testing requirements.

## Financial Aid

The United States government provides tuition, room and board, and medical and dental care. In addition, a cadet receives an annual salary from which is taken the cost of uniforms, books, a personal computer and living incidentals.

Preparation for West Point requires a sound secondary school education. It is recommended that applicants complete four years of mathematics, including trigonometry; four years of English; four years of science, including two years of laboratory science, such as chemistry and physics; two years of a foreign language; and one year of history. You will also find it helpful to take a precalculus or calculus course and a basic computer course, if offered at your school.

If you complete college-level courses before entering West Point, you may be able to validate your course work to obtain advanced placement, but you must complete four full years at West Point in order to graduate. Participating in school, church, scouting, and community activities will help you build a strong foundation

Upon graduation, you will be rewarded with a Bachelor of Science degree and a commission as a second lieutenant in the US Army. Most graduates who remain in the Army after - Active participation in sports is, by far, the best preparation for West Point's rigorous physical development program.
