To Parties Interested in BPA's Residential Exchange Program:

Earlier this month, BPA announced an initial public meeting to outline how we propose to move toward a resolution for providing the region with Residential Exchange Program (REP) benefits that are both equitable and consistent with the law. The meeting will provide interested parties an opportunity to learn more about the processes BPA intends to use to resolve REP issues and to hear perspectives from representatives of BPA, the utility community, and other regional stakeholders about how best to structure these processes to assure all necessary issues are adequately addressed and consistent with the law. Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments on the processes.

A tentative agenda is enclosed. Please note that due to the evolving nature of this effort, the agenda may change.
