To parties interested in BPA's Long-Term Regional Dialogue:

The Bonneville Power Administration invites you to attend a public meeting with Department of Energy (DOE) Deputy Secretary Clay Sell; DOE General Counsel David Hill; Director, Office of Electricity Delivery and Energy Reliability, Kevin Kolevar; and BPA Administrator and CEO Steve Wright.

The meeting will take place on December 6, 2006, from 2 – 6:30 p.m. at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport Conference Center located at 17801 International Blvd. (Pacific Highway S.), Seattle, Wash. Registration will begin at 1:30. Any changes will be posted on the BPA web site at [www.bpa.gov/power/regionaldialogue](http://www.bpa.gov/power/regionaldialogue).

BPA will be reviewing Regional Dialogue conclusions within the Administration before producing a final record of decision. This forum provides an opportunity for key DOE officials to hear directly from regional stakeholders in an open and unbiased manner. We expect this will facilitate production of the final ROD.

Regional representatives have been invited to participate in a series of panels. Invited panel members include representatives of public power, investor-owned utilities, direct-service industries, state and local government, tribes and constituents. Each panelist will have five minutes to share his or her comments on the Long-Term Regional Dialogue Policy Proposal. Thirty minutes will be available at the end of the meeting to allow interested parties who are not panel members to make a comment. Comments will be limited to two minutes in length to allow time for as many parties as possible. Since presentation time will be limited, and strictly enforced out of necessity, commenters are strongly encouraged to highlight the main points of their comments submitted during the Regional Dialogue public comment period, which will summarize and reflect months of analysis and regional discussions. Comments made during both the panel and open portions of the public hearing will become part of the Regional Dialogue public record and will be posted to the Regional Dialogue Web site.
