Second Annual AmeriCorps Video Contest

AmeriCorps is turning to its members and alums for help in recruiting individuals to service by hosting



the second YouTube-style video contest for this year's AmeriCorps Week (May 11–18). The contest, which runs through May 2, asks participants to create a 60second video that answers the question "Why AmeriCorps?"

The grand prize is a volunteer vacation worth up to \$5,000 — courtesy of Travelocity through its Travel for Good Change Ambassadors program. Second prize is an iPod Shuffle, third prize is an AmeriCorps Alums Prize Pack, and the five semifinalists will each receive a free one-year membership from AmeriCorps Alums.

The contest is limited to current AmeriCorps members and alums who have successfully completed their service. By May 9, a panel of judges will select five semifinalists; those entries will be available for viewing and voting at the video contest website during AmeriCorps Week. The top three videos will be unveiled at the National Conference on Volunteering and Service (June 1–3 in Atlanta). Read rules and enter:
