USDA Food Stamp Program Outreach Grants



USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) announces the funding of up to \$1 million in competitive grant funds through the Food Stamp Program.

The goal is to implement and study effective strategies to inform and educate potentially eligible low-income people who are not currently participating in the program about the nutrition benefits of the program, eligibility rules, and how to apply.

The maximum grant is \$75,000. Deadline is February 19, 2008.
