Earth Day Celebrates 40 Years in Service... to the Planet!



In September 1969, Wisconsin Senator Gaylord Nelson proposed a national "teach-in" on the environment to send a message to Washington that people across the nation were interested in pursuing a strong political agenda to address environmental issues. The response to his call was immediate and overwhelming and resulted in the very first Earth Day on April 22, 1970.

One in ten Americans participated in that first Earth Day — 20 million people took to the streets, parks, and auditoriums to increase environmental awareness by demonstrating for a more healthy and sustainable world. Today, Earth Day is recognized in more than 175 countries, with hundreds of millions of participants working toward a cleaner environment. The event continues to broaden the base of support for environmental programs, rekindle public commitment, and build community activism through a wide variety of activities.
