9/11 National Day of Service and Remembrance

In 2009, September 11 was officially recognized as a National Day of Service and Remembrance by the Serve America Act, passed with strong bipartisan support and signed into law by



President Obama. The President and First Lady issued a message urging Americans to serve on 9/11. For September 11, 2010, the Corporation for National and Community Service is supporting service activities in all fifty states by working with nonprofits, faith-based groups, government at all levels, businesses, and individuals to reignite the spirit of unity and service that inspired Americans in the days after the September 11, 2001 tragedy.

Commemorating this day not only helps to rekindle the spirit of service that emerged after the attacks, it also helps create a triumphant legacy for victims and their <u>loved ones left behind</u>. Flextronics Foundation: Disaster Relief

The Flextronics Foundation provides aid to relieve human suffering caused by a natural or civil disaster, or an emergency hardship. Do Something gives \$500 to young people (ages 25 or under) who have projects that assist in emergency situations – from disaster preparedness to first responders to those who are still working hard to rebuild. For project ideas, see what others have done. There is no deadline, so find out how to apply.
