The goal of NND is to reinforce local connections by fortifying relationships because a unified community is a stronger and healthier one. Use this annual celebration to promote and increase involvement in any number of cohesion-building and civic-minded activities. Neighborhood gatherings can be a simple block party or potluck, or a more complex service project, such as a neighborhood clean-up — whatever is easy and fun to plan and carry out. As a result of your NND event, your community may see an increase in volunteering, collaboration, emergency preparedness, and adult/youth mentoring relationships.
