#### NCD Quarterly Meeting: Issues **Affecting People with Disabilities**



The National Council on **Disability** will hold its next quarterly meeting at the Minneapolis

Marriott City Center, July 20 – July 22. NCD is an independent federal agency composed of 15 members appointed by the president; they consider it vital to hear from communities around the country on what works and what does not for people with disabilities.

This meeting is open to the public and will include sessions on emergency preparedness, housing, workforce infrastructure, access to outdoor recreation, international development, the Developmental Disabilities and Bill of Rights Act, strategic planning, and NCD's 2010 National Summit on Disability Policy. Specific times are designated to receive public comments, supported by a toll-free call-in line.
