What is Web 2.0 and what can it do for you? Just as it is essential for your organization or program to have an online presence (such as a website or an e-mail address), it's becoming more and more important to start participating in online networking and real-time conversations.



Web 2.0 technologies enable a level of communication, collaboration, and connection among people that is more sophisticated and interactive than ever before. These tools effectively convert web users from passive readers of static text on web pages to active creators of information and actively engaged members of online communities.
