Biliouris Named Special Assistant to NCUA's Executive Director

February 16, 2010, Alexandria, Va. — National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) today announced the selection of Matthew Biliouris to the new position of Special Assistant to the NCUA Executive Director. Biliouris will join the Office of the Executive Director effective March 8, 2010, after most recently serving as a program officer in the Office of Examination and Insurance.

“Matt Biliouris is an excellent selection for this new position. His breadth of experience and exceptional work ethic made him the logical choice, and those traits will be on display during these challenging times,” Chairman Debbie Matz commented on his selection.

As special assistant to the executive director, Biliouris will serve as a senior assistant and program specialist with policy and strategic responsibilities, and he will fill the key role of advisor to the executive director.

Biliouris joined NCUA in 1992 as an examiner in Portland, Maine. During his NCUA career, he served as a supervision analyst, information systems officer, and program officer. Biliouris has also completed several details, most notably serving a year-long assignment as Special Assistant to former NCUA Chairman and current Board Member Michael Fryzel.

Biliouris graduated with distinction from the University of Rhode Island in 1991 with a degree in business administration and a major in accounting.
